Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County



Supports more than 40,000 in-need people of all cultures and beliefs in their struggle to rise out of poverty each year in Santa Clara County. Catholic Charities alleviates the conditions of chronic poverty by providing food, housing assistance, and health services, and reduces the effects of situational poverty by providing jobs, immigration legal services, foster care, and financial education. Catholic Charities also prevents the cycle of generational poverty through early childhood development and parenting support.

Community Services Agency of MountainView and Los Altos



Provides a safety net for elderly, low-income, and homeless residents of Mountain View, Los Altos, and Los Altos Hills. Community Services Agency offers nutrition services, shopping assistance, and case management for seniors; food and emergency financial aid for low-income people; and comprehensive case management for homeless individuals and families.

Peninsula Family Service



Supports the region's most vulnerable children, families, and older adults by bringing early learning to the zip codes that need it most, helping families achieve personal and financial stability, and ensuring older adults have the resources to thrive. Through its programs in Early Learning, Financial Empowerment, and Older Adult Services, Peninsula Family Service serves 12,000 people annually in San Mateo, Santa Clara, San Benito, and Santa Cruz counties.

Puente de la Costa Sur



As the only community resource center on the San Mateo County South Coast, Puente advocates for a healthy, sustainable and inclusive community. Puente serves primarily low-income families and individuals in Pescadero, La Honda, Loma Mar, and San Gregorio through health, education and economic security programs and services.

Second Harvest of Silicon Valley



In Silicon Valley, many people have to choose paying rent over affording food. In fact, 1 in 4 people are at risk of hunger. At Second Harvest of Silicon Valley, we believe everyone should be healthy and housed. Last year, through our network of over 300 nonprofit partners, we served enough nutritious food for 57 million meals across Santa Clara and San Mateo counties. Half of the food distributed was fresh produce.

St. Francis Center of Redwood City



St. Francis Center provides food, clothing, housing and other essential services to low-income families that reside in the Redwood City and Fair Oaks communities. In response to COVID-19, we are focusing our efforts on food distribution, affordable housing and showers for the homeless. As a result of the "shelter in place" orders many of our tenants/clients are losing hours or have lost their jobs and are already struggling with paying their monthly rent. While we are trying to accommodate their situations, we may not have sufficient reserves to pay the debt service/mortgages on our properties if the situation lasts longer than 3 months.

St. Joseph's Family Center



Alleviates hunger and homelessness in South Santa Clara County by providing food, housing, emergency utility assistance, and employment services, and advocating for system changes to improve the quality of life for the most vulnerable people in the community. Starting as a volunteer effort, St. Joseph's has served the Gilroy area for more than 35 years.

Sunnyvale Community Services



Sunnyvale Community Services Since 1970, Sunnyvale Community Services (SCS) has worked to prevent homelessness and hunger in our local community. SCS provides safety-net services for over 9,000 low-income individuals, including families, seniors, veterans and homeless persons, offering emergency financial aid for rent and other critical bills, year-round food assistance, onsite referrals to benefits, and intensive case management. Over 2,500 volunteers keep costs low and stretch our budget.

West Valley Community Services of Santa Clara County



Provides critical food, housing, and support services to low-income and homeless individuals and families in Cupertino, West San Jose, Los Gatos, Saratoga, and Monte Sereno. West Valley Community Services distributes more than 1,000,000 pounds of food to low-income and homeless families each year.
