Housing and Homelessness Services

Silicon Valley faces a housing crisis of epic proportions, which affects the lives of all who live or work in the region. Abode Services

Abode Services secures supportive homes for individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Santa Clara, San Mateo, Alameda, Santa Cruz, Napa, and San Francisco counties by applying the innovative Housing First approach, to go beyond the temporary solutions that shelters and transitional housing programs offer. The Housing First Approach recognizes that someone who is homeless doesn't need a series of hoops to jump through; they need a home. On any given night, 2,100 people are off the streets and in safe housing through Abode's programs, and since 2010, more than 10,730 formerly homeless individuals have been rehoused.

Destination: Home



Destination: Home is a public-private partnership that uses collective impact strategies to accomplish its mission of ending homelessness in Santa Clara County. Working in partnership with the County, Destination: Home drives and aligns resources to create permanent housing and sustainable support systems built for the long term, improve how systems work together to end homelessness, and protect individuals and families at risk of becoming homeless.

Downtown Streets Team



Downtown Streets Team helps people find their way out of homelessness and creates clean, vibrant, and welcoming communities. Team Members volunteer to beautify city streets and neighborhoods, and clean waterways in 15 communities across the Bay Area. In return, they earn a basic needs stipend for food, shelter, clothing, communication, and transportation. Downtown Streets Team also provides support services which help Team Members remove barriers to jobs and housing.

HomeFirst Services of Santa Clara County



Provides services, shelter, and housing opportunities to the homeless and those at risk of homelessness in Santa Clara County. HomeFirst serves more than 5,000 adults, veterans, families, and youth each year at seven locations, including the county's largest homeless services center, and is relentlessly focused on helping those they serve find and keep permanent housing.

HIP Housing



Specializing in creative affordable housing solutions throughout San Mateo County, HIP Housing's programs promote workforce housing and the prevention of displacement and homelessness. Their Home Sharing, Property Development, and Self Sufficiency Program for Families showcase the use of existing housing stock in highly innovative ways.

LifeMoves



Provides interim housing and supportive services for homeless families and individuals to rapidly return to stable housing and achieve long-term self-sufficiency. On any given night, LifeMoves feeds, clothes and houses over 750 Peninsula and Silicon Valley residents experiencing homelessness, about one-half of whom are children.

St. Francis Center of Redwood City



St. Francis Center provides food, clothing, housing and other essential services to low-income families that reside in the Redwood City and Fair Oaks communities. In response to COVID-19, we are focusing our efforts on food distribution, affordable housing and showers for the homeless. As a result of the "shelter in place" orders many of our tenants/clients are losing hours or have lost their jobs and are already struggling with paying their monthly rent. While we are trying to accommodate their situations, we may not have sufficient reserves to pay the debt service/mortgages on our properties if the situation lasts longer than 3 months.

SV@Home
