#### Californians for Justice

Empowers youth of color to push for racial justice and transform schools into places where all students have the opportunity and support needed to succeed in college, career, and life. Californians for Justice works statewide, and has trained hundreds of youth from San Jose to be community leaders and organizers, and transform school policies.

#### Community Legal Services in East Palo Alto (CLSEPA)

CLSEPA provides transformative legal services in the areas of immigration, housing, and economic advancement. Low-income communities and communities of color in East Palo Alto and surrounding areas are subject to the systemic forces of exclusion, inequity, and exploitation. CLSEPA partners with community-based groups to help each person exercise their strength, power, and legal rights. CLSEPA's expert staff, along with hundreds of dedicated volunteers, helps over 6,000 community members each year.

#### Law Foundation of Silicon Valley

Leverages innovative legal advocacy as a tool for social change. The team of attorneys, social workers, community workers, and pro bono attorneys work together to create a community where all have access: to a home, to quality education, and to healthcare, including mental healthcare. The Law Foundation serves over 10,000 individuals and families each year.

## Legal Aid Society of San Mateo County

Fights social injustice by representing low-income residents of San Mateo County in civil legal matters including housing, domestic abuse, immigration, public benefits access, disability rights, education, and senior services. In just one year, Legal Aid opened cases impacting over 6,000 low-income individuals. Legal Aid also engages in systems-change advocacy at the county and state levels, and uses local data to support their advocacy work and to improve client services.

## People Acting in Community Together (PACT)

A multi-faith, grassroots organization that provides leadership training and experience to community members of many different ethnic, religious, and socio-economic backgrounds. PACT challenges themselves and all those with power to catalyze a movement to end racial and economic inequalities in Silicon Valley, focusing on economic justice, education equity, immigrant rights, and justice system reform at the local, state, and national levels.
